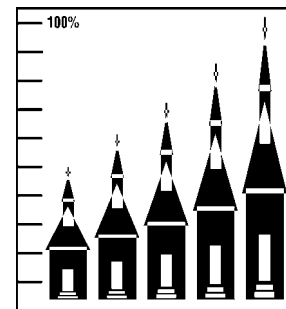

CAPITAL CAMPAIGN REPORT

As of Sunday, April 20th, \$ 561,000 is pledged toward the \$ 650,000 capital campaign goal, with additional calls yet to be made.

We are extremely grateful to the campaign steering committee, led by Chairman **Jim Magennis**, which includes **Phil Doyle, Mary Lee Dunn, Beth Lingenheld, Kristin Oswald, Harriet Vose, Jane Watson and Phil Worley**. The steering committee gives thanks to church members who filled 82 volunteer positions, especially the 44 people who volunteered to visit every household on behalf of the church. These visits have provided members with a time to make new friends and strengthen longtime friendships. Parishioners are responding enthusiastically to the opportunity to discuss our mission and invite others to enter more fully into the life of the church.

A committee will be appointed to follow up with outstanding donors and to collect pledges over the next three years. Donors can begin pledge payments immediately and are

encouraged to take advantage of the tax year end in making payments on pledges. All donations will be acknowledged in yearend statements.
